HAPPY SPRING

This is a very unusual spring for our country and our community. Social distancing is our new normal for a while yet. This does make a difference to us as a lake community. We encourage you to still get outside and enjoy the beauty of Crockery Lake.

Spring Clean-up

We ask that all residents inspect their shoreline for debris and loose objects that could be picked up by rising waters with the spring thaw and eventual rain showers. Organic material such as leaves, sticks, and other yard waste make great fertilizer for the spring weeds to flourish so those should be removed. Timber, dock sections, and even children's toys have been known to travel with the rising waters. We ask for your help, not only to protect personal property, but to help keep our outlet clear of items that could dam up the exiting waters. Thank you for your help and consideration in keeping our lake clean.

CLA ANNUAL MEETING

The Annual Meeting usually held in May has been postponed until the quarantine is lifted. This board meeting will still be held at Grose Park and we will keep you informed when a new date is set. CELEBRATING INDEPENDENCE DAY CROCKERY LAKE STYLE

We will be celebrating Independence Day on Friday, July 3, 2020. Here is the schedule:

1 ~ The <u>boat parade</u> will get underway at 7:30 pm. Entries will register at the CLA Treasurer's house by 6:00 pm the day of the event. Each boat will be given a numbered sign which is to be attached to the boat and visible for the judges to see. The numbered signs must be turned back in to the treasurer after two circuits of the lake are completed. Any lake resident may enter a boat in the parade, BUT only members of the Crockery Lake Association are eligible for a cash prize.

 \sim Boats will queue up at the treasurer's house by 7:15 pm for pictures on the day of the parade.

~ A head judge and 4 other judges will be appointed by the CLA Board at the June Board Meeting.

a. Judges must be members of the CLA.

b. Judges must phone, text, or email their votes to the head judge within thirty minutes of the last boat passing the judge's house.

c. The head judge will tabulate the votes and phone or email the results to the Treasurer within one hour after the parade is over.

d. The treasurer will phone or email the winners before the fireworks begin.

e. The Treasurer will distribute the prize money within five days of the parade. If there is a tie, the money will be divided. Only CLA members can win the prize money.

UPDATED MICHIGAN BOATER SAFETY BOOKS

We will once again acquire Boater Safety Books. They will be available to you through your CLA board members and at the Boat Landing on the south side of the lake. Please report any boating violations or boater safety concerns to the authorities. Please use the non-emergency number 1-800-249-0911.

2020 CHEMICAL TREATMENT DATES

Crockery Lake Schedule of Weed & Algae Treatments for 2020 have not been set yet due to the pandemic. Please watch the facebook page and the webpage for notification of treatment dates.

Here is what to expect:

~DEQ permitting restrictions, national holidays, and/or weather conditions may influence the timing of treatments throughout the 2020 season.

~PLM treats each lake according to a schedule or season established with the cooperation of your lake association, lake board or residents on the lake.

~The treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5x11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and <u>any</u> <u>restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns,</u> etc. The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) procedures.

~On the day of treatment, signs will be posted along the shoreline within 100 feet of treatment areas that indicate what products were used and specific water use restrictions that apply.

~The chemicals used for Aquatic Nuisance Control are registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Michigan Department of Agriculture. The potential for damage to fish and other non-target organisms is minimal provided that the product is used as directed on the product label and the permit.

~The CLA Board of Directors would suggest using caution in using or being in the water the day of treatment according to posted warnings.

DISCOUNTED SEPTIC PUMPING SERVICES

Your family's health and the lake's water quality depends on keeping your septic system healthy. By pumping regularly, you will avoid costly repairs to your system. This is a very important way in which all residents can help preserve the health of Crockery Lake. **Kerkstra's Septic** 616-662-2322 continues to offer a \$15 discount per septic tank to Crockery Lake residents.

SPRING THINGS - TO DO (OR DON'T DO LIST)

Oak trees—don't prune April 15 - July 15. Increases possibility of infestation by fungal disease, allows native picnic beetles to spread spores from infected trees to healthy trees; oak wilt causes rapid defoliation and die back in the crown, killing red oak trees in a matter of weeks. Treatment can be costly and destructive—prevention is key!

Need firewood for your lake campfires? Purchase your firewood locally, or buy your firewood where you plan to burn it.

Re-landscaping? Add some native plants!

Clean up animal waste-don't let it end up in the lake.

Clean out your firepit and dispose of the ashes—so they don't end up in the lake.

Don't let those TV commercials for lawn fertilizers get to you! According to the MSU Extension Office, most lawns in Michigan have adequate levels of phosphorous without adding chemicals to your lawn.

Use lake water to water your lawn. Your lawn will have more than enough nutrients to keep it green. <u>Do not water on days the lake is sprayed.</u>

You can still use crabgrass killer (without fertilizer) and other insecticides.

No types of fertilizers may be used within 300 feet of the lake.

No grass clippings, leaves, sticks, etc. may be placed in the lake.

Fertilizers applied by lawn fertilizer companies are prohibited. If you see your neighbor violating this ordinance, please remind him of the ban. Violation of this ordinance may result in a \$500 fine.

Put reflectors on your rafts. Phone numbers should be added to your paddle boats and kayaks.
